Policy Statement

New Pastures is committed to providing a broad, balanced, inclusive, and engaging curriculum that supports the educational, social, emotional, and personal development of all learners. Our curriculum is designed to meet the individual needs of children and young people through therapeutic, practical, academic, and vocational based learning experiences.

At New Pastures, we believe that every learner deserves the opportunity to achieve success, develop confidence, and build the skills necessary for lifelong learning, independence, and positive wellbeing.

1. Aims of the Curriculum

The curriculum at New Pastures aims to:

- Provide a safe, nurturing, and inclusive learning environment.

- Support emotional wellbeing, resilience, and self-esteem.
- Develop academic, vocational, practical, and life skills.
- Encourage respect, responsibility, and positive relationships.
- Promote engagement through experiential and outdoor learning.
- Support learners to re-engage with education and achieve personal success.
- Prepare learners for adulthood, employment, further education, and community participation.

2. Curriculum Principles

As a City and Guilds accredited Centre, our curriculum is derived from the vocational courses that we deliver, including animal care, hair and beauty and functional skills. Social skills development, wellbeing and being a place of safety where our learners can access learning is imperative to our delivery.

Individualised

Learning is tailored to the needs, interests, abilities, and EHCP outcomes of each learner where applicable.

Inclusive

All learners are supported to access the curriculum regardless of background, need, ability, or prior educational experience.

Therapeutic

We recognise the impact of trauma, anxiety, SEND, and adverse childhood experiences on learning. Staff use relational and trauma-informed approaches.

Practical and Experiential

Hands-on learning opportunities are embedded throughout the curriculum, particularly through outdoor education, animal care, horticulture, farm-based activities and practical hair and beauty activities

Holistic

The curriculum supports academic progress alongside emotional regulation, communication, social development, and independence.

- Positive destinations and transitions.

5. Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

New Pastures is committed to inclusive practice and supporting learners with SEND.

Staff work collaboratively to:

- Identify barriers to learning.
- Provide reasonable adjustments.
- Adapt teaching and activities.
- Use supportive strategies and interventions.
- Work in partnership with parents, carers, schools, and professionals.
- Support learners to achieve outcomes identified in EHCPs

6. Safeguarding and Wellbeing

Safeguarding is central to the curriculum at New Pastures.

The curriculum supports learners to:

- Understand how to keep themselves safe.
- Develop healthy relationships.
- Recognise risks and seek support.
- Build emotional resilience.
- Develop self-regulation and coping strategies.

All staff follow safeguarding procedures in line with our Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy.

7. Assessment and Monitoring

Assessment is used to inform planning and support progress.

Methods may include:

- Learner voice

- Progress tracking
- Photographic evidence
- Reports to schools, parents, and professionals

Progress is recognised academically, socially, emotionally, and practically.

- Take responsibility for their learning and behaviour.
